

Sample Daisy Day Event

We've held a Daisy Day Camp for the last three or four years now. It's not been that hard to plan - it just takes a little time and troop interest.

We run our camp from 9 am - 3 pm. We run five different stations, with 45 minutes allotted per station (this includes 'travel' time').

That gives us a basic schedule of:

9:00 - 9:15	Arrival & check in
9:15 - 9:30	Welcome & Flag Ceremony
9:30 - 10:15	Station 1
10:15 - 11:00	Station 2
11:00 - 11:45	Lunch
11:45 - 12:30	Station 3
12:30 - 1:00	Snack
1:00 - 1:45	Station 4
1:45 - 2:30	Station 5
2:30 - 3:00	Closing Ceremony, Clean up, SWAPS, etc

We have each troop bring enough SWAPs to share with everyone coming. We have each troop bring one ingredient for GORP (which is our snack) and the SU provides punch/Kool-Aid for snack. We have each girl bring their own sack lunch and drink (troops bring a cooler for their girls). Each troop is responsible for planning and conducting one station, which they repeat for each group (presenting that same station a total of 5 times). We've been picking a Journey to focus our activities around, so that leaders who choose to work on that Journey throughout the year will have some wrap up activities to go with it. We also try to make one of our stations meet the requirements for a Brownie badge, so that leaders can use Daisy Day Camp to help with Bridging preparation.

We charge enough for Daisy Day Camp to recoup our costs (lodge rental, materials for the stations, patches, etc.) and usually keep the costs down pretty good.
