Toucans live in Southern Mexico, Central America, the northern portion of South America, and the Caribbean. Even though they have a very large **beak**, toucans rely on other animals to hollow out the trees where they make their **nests**.

Toucans use their **colorful** beaks to attract mates and to reach for **fruit** and other food. Toucans can even peel fruit with their beaks. Besides fruit, toucans will sometimes eat **insects**, young birds, eggs, or lizards.

Toucans can even regulate body temperature by adjusting the flow of blood to their beak. More blood flow means more heat is released. When toucans sleep, they tuck their beak under their feathers to keep them warm.

The legs of the toucan are strong and short. Their toes are arranged in pairs with the first and fourth toes turned backward allowing them to grasp tree branches.

Toucans spend a lot of time in trees, but they are not very good at flying. Toucans mainly travel among trees by hopping. When they do take flight, they flap their wings vigorously and glide, traveling only short distances.

Toucans live in small groups. They groom each other by removing remove dust and sticky seeds by gently nibbling one another's feathers with the tips of their beaks.
